Behold

The word behold is not one that we often use anymore. The Oxford Dictionary does attribute its meaning to be "to see or observe especially a remarkable person or thing." If you are looking for amusement, try working it into your conversations today. What might you ask others to "Behold!"? Somehow, our everyday

actions do not seem worthy of this word. "Behold, I picked up a gallon of milk on the way home," just does not seem to work.

Sources I found said that the word *behold* appeared in the King James Version of the Bible 1,298 times. But *behold* is used less and less in contemporary translations. In the New King James version, *behold* is used only about half as often – 586 times. And in translations that more closely echo contemporary English, the word is a rarity, appearing only 27 times in the New Revised Standard Version (the one we use at CLC) and only once in the New International Version.

Perhaps we have lost something with the disappearance of the Scripture translations word behold from our and corresponding erasure from our culture. Do we really know how to behold? How to stop still, to cease all else, to give our full attention and searching gaze to what is before us? In our multi-tasking, fast-paced world, we are in the habit of looking everywhere at once with the result that nothing (and no one) truly has our deep and undivided attention. As I think of the Advent and Christmas season, I wonder what I should give my attention to in order to behold Mary and Joseph on the way to Bethlehem, baby Jesus in the stable, the angels singing, the shepherds on the mountaintop, the magi paying homage. Can you not hear them all exclaiming, "Behold!"?

During this season, may we all exclaim "Behold" as we see and observe a remarkable child, the Christ child, that came to save the world.

Advent Is Upon Us "The Glory of the Lord Shall be Revealed"

Advent began on December 3, and it continues for the following three Sundays.

The theme chosen for this year was chosen in part by some of the words that appear around the base of our Advent Wreath. If we all got up really close and personal to it, you would see that it reads, "Behold the Lord shall make the glory of his voice to be heard in the joy of your heart." These words are loosely connected to words of faith from Isaiah chapter forty that reads this way, "And the glory of the Lord shall be revealed. and all humanity will see



it together, for the mouth of the Lord has spoken." People of God, the goal of our faith is to bring glory to God so that it might be revealed to others.

Come and join us for Advent worship where each Sunday we light one additional candle as we wait for *the glory of the Lord* to be revealed.



Looking Ahead to Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday this year is **February 14th**. It is the day that marks the beginning of the Season of Lent, and once again we will gather



in worship and celebrate Holy Communion as we begin the journey to the cross with Jesus. As we enter into the Lenten period of 40 days, our worship also includes a time when we mark with ashes the sign of the cross on one's forehead, a ritual which has been part of Ash Wednesday worship over all the centuries. This visible sign not only identifies us as followers as Christ Jesus, but also reminds us of our deep need for God's love and mercy in our lives. The worship service on Ash Wednesday is scheduled for 7:00 p.m.



Kikatiti Secondary School

Christ Lutheran has had a longterm relationship with The Kikatiti Secondary school in Tanzania. The school is a Christian based school and works with the Lutheran Church of Tanzania. The

support helps students further their education. It was eight years ago that Christ Lutheran had a team visit Tanzania to see and help at the school. The students are very glad to be there. Many of the students are boarded at the school. The monies primarily help with tuition (to those who can't afford school), provide textbooks, and food. Bill Koeckeritz, formerly of New Ulm, led our group. He makes regular visits, and went there again this past summer. He says, "The student's passion, enthusiasm, and gratitude for the opportunity remains steadfast."

Christ Luther continues to send \$200 in missions support per month to the Kikatiti school . This fund is different than the general fund. To make gifts to the mission fund, please designate missions on your check memo. Additional gifts can be designated for the school if you label your checks as "Kikatiti Secondary School." Your continued support of the school and the missionary fund is greatly appreciated.
